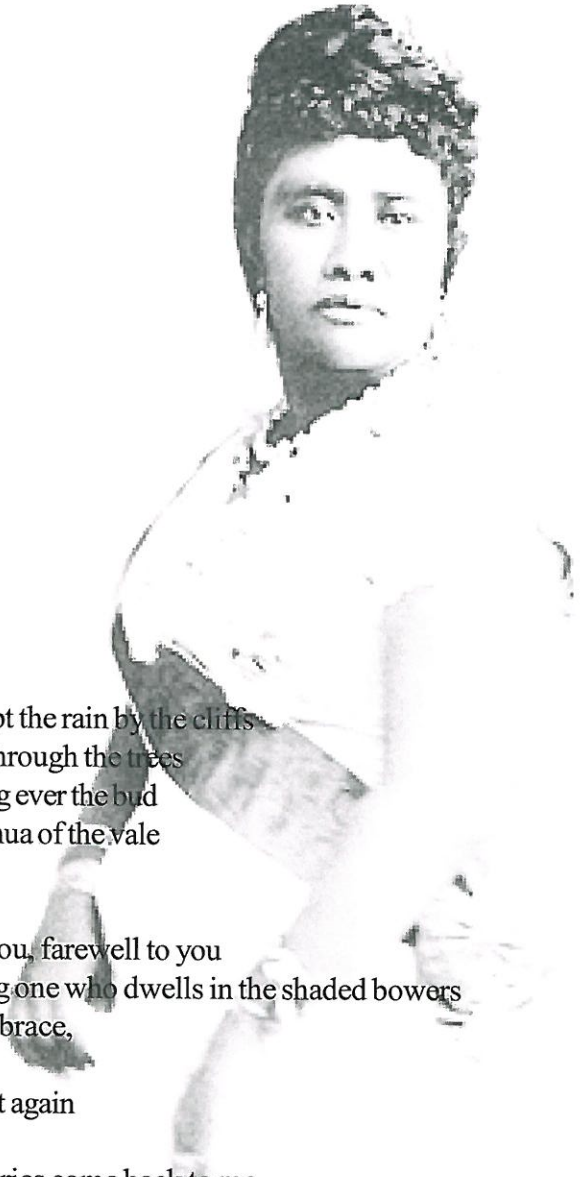

Until we meet again

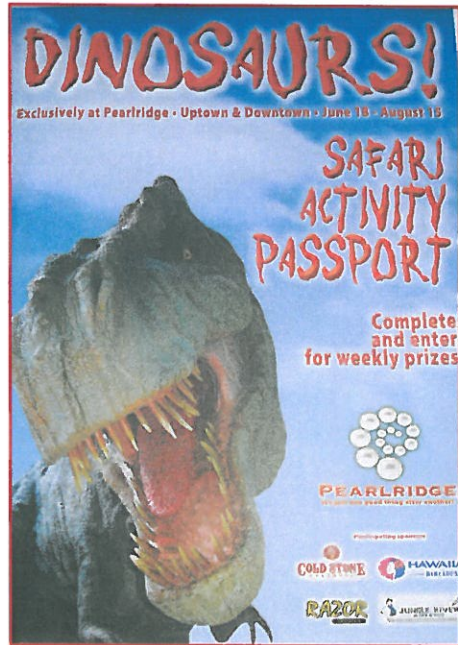

*Dinosaurs!* opened June 18 and ran through August 15, 2010.

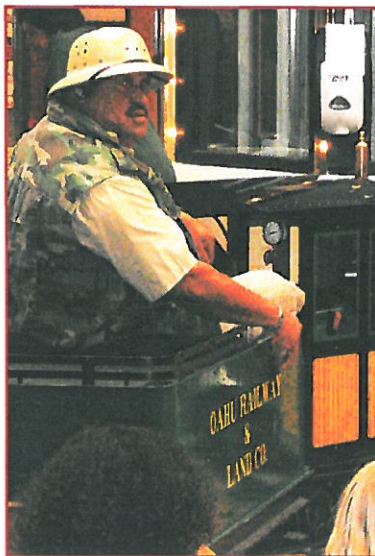

### Nominations Chair Appointed

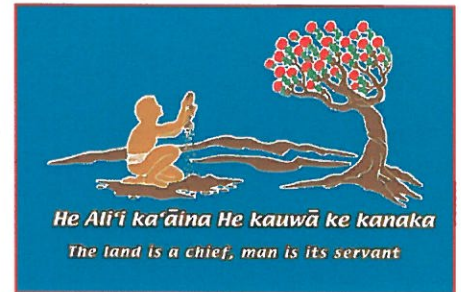
