MAUNA `ALA



ALI'I SUNDAY KAMEHAMEHA III

Our Club attended two Ali`i Sundays in August.

The First was for Kamehameha III on August 6, 2023. He was born Kau`ikeaouli and he was the third King of the Kingdom. Under his reign, Hawai`i evolved from an absolute to a constitutional monarchy with the signing of the first Hawaiian Language Constitution in 1840 and the Constitution of 1852. He was the longest ruling Monarch, ruling for 29 years part of which was under regents Queen Ka`ahumanu and later Ka`ahumanu II. His goal was the careful balancing of modernization by adopting Western ways, while keeping his nation intact. One of the things that he was noted for was that he started the Royal Hawaiian Band.



ALI'I SUNDAY HONRING QUEEN LILI'UOKALANI

The Ali`i Sunday honoring our Beloved Queen Lili`uokalani was held on Sunday, August 27, 2023. Historically, we would decorate the chapel and the Queen's Statue for the Ali`i Sunday.
